

### The Monthly Message from Nathan Sant

Firstly, (and I know it is a bit late) Happy New Year!

We hope you are all well and have started the new year well.

My year has started very well as I have just been made the youth pastor for our church. This year as a youth group we have started looking at the topic of holiness.

Now I know as soon as the word holiness is mentioned, you may have felt a little uneasy and uncomfortable, as do many Christians when this subject is brought up. It's ok though, because it's nothing to be afraid of! In fact, it is quite beautiful, liberating and fulfilling when it is understood properly.

1 Peter 1 verses 15 & 16 say:

But now you must be holy in everything you do, just as God who chose you is holy. For the Scriptures say, "You must be holy be-cause I am holy.""

The original Greek word for **holy** is 'hagios' which means acceptable to God. Now just sit and think about that for just one moment! It's a very big statement! Do you feel acceptable to God?

I guess by now you could be feeling quite condemned and guilty as most of us do when we see or hear the word *holy*. But please don't worry there is really good news in this message.

You see holiness comes in two parts, the first part is our position in Christ or who we are because of Jesus' death. You see if you are a Christian (as in you believe that Jesus died for you, and that He endured the entire wrath of God, for you and all the wrong things you have done, and you believe that on the third day God raised Jesus up from the dead, thus paying the price of sin, which is death, for you) then you are already holy.

Yep you are already holy!

On top of that bombshell, comes this: before God even made the world, before He uttered the words "*let there be*" you were already in His mind and set aside to be holy!

Confused? Let's look at Ephesians 1 v 4

"Long before he laid down earth's foundations, he had us in mind, had settled on us as the focus of his love, to be made whole and holy by his love."

So don't feel condemned! If you are a Christian then you are already holy, you are already acceptable to God! Yep you can say it; WOW!!!!!!

That's what Jesus did on the cross, His death made us Holy! There is nothing that we, ourselves could have done, we needed Jesus! That is the beauty and power of grace its fullest sense.

But (and there is always a but!), out of that comes our second part to holiness. Which is our behaviour as a result of this position in Jesus.

This is where it gets tricky because when you have a true encounter with Jesus, you cannot help but come away being changed. We can see this throughout the gospels. Anyone who met Jesus left that encounter changed.

Just as a little aside here: one of the biggest excuses that I have heard people say to me when confronted with this message of Jesus is, "Jesus could never love me, you don't know what I have done! I've done too much!". The way I respond to this is to look at Paul! Before he became a follower of Jesus (and wrote most of the New Testament) he was a Christian killer! He deliberately hunted down Christians to kill them all in the name of the Law! But then on the road to Damascus he had an encounter with Jesus and left forever changed! His behaviour changed too! If Jesus can love Paul, then he can love you!

In this very same way our behaviour changes completely when we meet Jesus, the old is gone and has given way to the new. We live by a new standard which means that we are no longer angry or we don't use foul language anymore, we no longer have sex outside of marriage or we no (Continued on page 5)

ent, they could stay with their parents and friends for the service and the oldest member of the congregation who was 80+ said that she really enjoyed it as it gave her a chance to make something and be creative which she didn't normally get to do during the week.

How is it funded? A donation is made for your breakfast; I didn't get to find out if this covers craft materials as well or if that is funded by the church resources.

Could it work at Sinfin? Would we draw in more families with a more relaxed approach? Would it turn some of our regular members away? These were all the questions that we had on the car journey home.

I can only say that from my perspective, - yes I think it would work at Sinfin occasionally, provided the congregation were given plenty of warning of the service and what it would entail, and what would be expected of them.

I would like to think that we could draw in more families; it is definitely something that members of our own congregation could bring their grandchildren to. It may also attract people on their own who are perhaps lonely and would like company and someone to talk to over breakfast.

Initially it would take a little bit of work to set up but could see it being used as a really useful outreach tool.

Would it turn away some of our regular members? I would hope not, our congregation are fair and friendly, they all get on well together and I would hope that they would give it a go, and give feedback on anything that they thought could be useful or indeed anything that they didn't like.

So what do you all think? I had a really lovely day, I got to go out with friends, eat food, meet new people, do craft, sing and learn more of Jesus, what more can you ask of a day?

longer go out and get drunk with our friends, we do business the right way instead of looking to make the biggest profit no matter the cost and we no longer harbour unforgiveness in our hearts. Our behaviour on the outside becomes a reflection of what has happened in our hearts!

The thing with holiness is, we will never ever be completely pure and perfectly holy as God intended on this earth, we live in a fallen world and a fallen body. But we can pursue holiness with all our heart! That is what is required when we follow Jesus.

We live in a world where wrong is being seen as right and right as wrong. Holiness is no longer a priority in many people's lives. Soon it is going to get harder and harder to talk about Jesus publicly. Therefore, our actions are going to need to speak louder than our words. That is what Jesus meant when He said in Matthew 5 v 13-16 that we are the salt of the earth and the light of the world. By pursuing holiness, we are displaying to the world the very love of Jesus.

So I ask you this: have you had a true encounter with Jesus? If the answer is no then ask him to show himself to you, He is faithful. If the answer is yes, then the question has to be do you display that through your behaviour?

Be encouraged that God loves you enough that even before the foundations of the world were set in place. He knew that he would have to give everything He had to make you holy. Yet He still did it!

### Café Church - Three play away!

7.00 am on a very wet Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> January Susan picked up Julie and myself and we set out to visit South Cerney United Church, this is a Church that some of Susan's friends attend and is a Methodist/Congregational Church. Why did we go? We went to take part and see what goes on at their Café Church.

We arrived at around 9.40 am and were made very welcome and invited to join in with breakfast, the breakfast had everything that you could possibly want and more besides, so much so that we were unable to eat anything further until 3.30 pm - just ask Julie about the warm bread rolls! Over breakfast people continued to arrive and join in, newspapers were available for those that wanted them, colouring sheets kept the children busy after they had finished eating, and friends had time to chat and catch up with what had gone on during their week, everyone sitting around tables and sharing, it was all very relaxed non-threatening and informal, some folk came along but just for the service and didn't have breakfast.

The worship started at around 10.30 am, we stayed seated around the tables and the service was led by a couple from the Church, the theme for the day being 'Lamb of God'. We had a hymn, prayers and a short introduction to the service followed by the Bible reading taken from John 1 v 29-30, 35-42, we then had an activity - we were given a list of Bible readings to look up together as a table and had to decide which Bible reading was the odd one out, doing it as a table meant that the children could take part with their parents and others and made all feel included. We then had another hymn before activity two which was to make individual sheep pictures with of cotton wool, crayons etc. Again ask Julie hers was not just a sheep picture more a rural scene! The service finished with more prayer and a final hymn, after which everyone tidied up together, leaving the Church at around 12.00 noon.

We talked to several of the members whilst we were there and asked what they liked or disliked about Café Church, the children said that they liked it because they didn't have to go out and do something differ-(Continued on page 12) Christian Aid Week 2017 - ( 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary ) christian Christian Aid was actually founded in 1945, to support hundreds of thousands of refugees who lost their homes and possessions in the Second



World War. This work was ongoing ... and in 1957, Christian Aid launched their first ever "Christian Aid Week", appealing to the public to help fund the churches' relief efforts. Christian Aid says, ". Sixty years ago, Christians refused to stand by while people suffered in refugee camps. Our generation is rising to that challenge again. We won't turn our backs on the plight of today's refugees"

Although it may seem quite a way off yet, I just want to let you know that "Christian Aid Week", this year, will officially run from Sunday, 14<sup>th</sup> to Saturday, 20<sup>th</sup> of May. Our main event this year will be a Coffee Morning and Mini-Market, which is planned for Saturday, 13<sup>th</sup> of May... from 10.00 a.m. until 12.30 p.m. There will be various stalls, including cakes and other edible goodies, a craft stall, bric-a-brac and a 50p. "Prize-every-Time" stall, as well as refreshments. So...... if you are "crafty" and could produce an item or two for our craft stall, that would be great. Also...donations of gifts for the "Prize-every-Time" stall would be most welcome and, nearer the time, bric-a-brac and home-made "eatables". Our overall theme will be " All things bright and beautiful ..... All creatures great and small" ... so, anything attractive and saleable will be most appreciated, though it would be nice to include some items depicting animals/birds etc. We shall continue to collect small change (copper and silver), as this has been so worthwhile in the past.....so keep on saving! **Building Works Fund** 


