## The Monthly Message by Nathan Sant

Can I ask you a question?

What's in your past?

Would you say it's good? Or are there some grizzly skeletons in it?

Be honest now, It's just between you and God. He doesn't get shocked! In fact, He already knows the answer.

I know I have done things that I am not proud of!

I guess we all have done things that we really aren't proud of. I think it's worse for us as Christians too, everyone seems to judge us a lot quicker. But everyone is human. What is it that Paul says to the Romans? All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God! (Rom 3:23) So we are all sinners, only God is just.

But I want to talk to you about someone who slipped from a very great height!

His name was David and he dropped the ball big time. (The full story is in 2 Samuel 11&12)

David was a king. In fact, he was THE king, the king who God had chosen to rule His people. David had beaten Goliath, He had won many, many battles and David had bought the Ark of the covenant back to Jerusalem. David was a living legend, he was known as a man after God's own heart. Yet David saw a pretty girl he liked bathing on the roof of a house close to his palace and he slept with her.

Now by today's standards that wasn't very scandalous. But the thing is, Bathsheba was already married. In fact, she was actually married to one of David's soldiers, who was out fighting for him on the frontline at that very moment, and he knew it. My guess is that David thought he could get away with it and that no-one would ever know. But unfortunately for him, Bathsheba became pregnant.

So now David is in a bit of a fix. The scandal that would happen if this got out. So David decides to sort it out himself. He cooks up a plan to have Uriah come home and be with Bathsheba then it will cover it all up and he will be ok. What he didn't account for though, was the fact that Uriah (Bathsheba's husband) was an honourable man who couldn't go and be with his wife while the rest of his men were on the battlefield. Uriah was so committed to his soldiers and his king, that he slept in the doorway of David's palace. David then makes another plan, He decides to send

Uriah to the frontline and have him killed. The he thinks it will all be ok, and no-one knows.

Believe it or not, that is what happened, Uriah got killed, Bathsheba mourned and then David took her as his wife. I'm pretty sure that David had though he had gotten away with it, but God saw the whole thing, and He was not happy.

God sends the prophet Nathan to confront David. Nathan does this in a way that makes David realise what he has done and confess it.

So why am I telling you all of this? What is my point?

This story is incredibly rich and we could get so much out of it. But did you know that after all of this David is still known today as a man after God's own heart!

But how? He messed up in a monumental way, adultery, murder, lies and deceit are not small things.

The key, is David's response. When God called him out on his sin, David responded by confessing to it, in fact Psalm 51 is David's confession and his appeal to God for mercy.

See the thing is with sin, it loves darkness. It loves to sit inside our hearts, where no one can see it. When sin is in darkness it has all the power over us. Why? Because the devil can come along and use it against us. He can whisper in our ear "do you remember the you did that?", or, "what would people think of you if they knew you had done that?". In doing this he leads us into a prison cell, but this prison cell isn't made up of iron bars. It's made up of bars of guilt and shame. The devil will keep you focused on those bars of guilt and shame, because this cell that he has lead you into isn't locked, the door may be shut, but it isn't locked. The devil doesn't have the authority to lock that door. He isn't the judge, juror or jailer. Jesus is!

If you are a Christian, you have the freedom to walk out of that cell at any point you want. All you have to do is confess your sin. Because then it is bought out into the light and then it has no power over you. You cannot be kept in the cell. In fact, the cell should not exist, because the devil will accuse us in front of Jesus, and Jesus will say: "I know! Yes, they did that! But the price has been paid."

When Jesus died on that cross, all our guilt and shame died with him. The devil is a deceiver and doesn't want you to know that. He wants you

# Building Works Fund (BWF)

This fund continues to be blessed with your generosity and at the end of October stood at an impressive £40,829.

That said, we must remind ourselves that we are in debt to the tune of £35,000 though we do have to pay the first instalment of £2,000 to the Bishop of Derby this coming week (the loan



was £10,000 over 5 years paying £2,000 a year for 5 years).

In November, the Church Council will be making decisions on paying back some of our loans and in December we will have to pay the final payment (around £4,400) for the new roof and Welcome Area.

This means that by the end of the year we will know exactly where we stand and we can then plan for any future developments.

We will continue to keep you up-to-date with what is happening with this fund.

## Vincent Martin - An Update (in his own words!)

My dear friends, I first of all want to take this opportunity to thank each and everyone of you from the bottom of my heart, for all of the cards and well wishes I have received since the onset of my illness and subsequent time spent in hospital. I can't deny that it has been tough but your thoughts and prayers have sustained me through this difficult time so far and will continue to do so no matter what the future has in store. Just to keep you in the picture I spent



the best part of nearly 2 weeks in hospital, the first was particularly difficult as I had a terrible reaction to some of the medication, particularly morphine (I had been on a lot) causing me to spend just over a week in and out of consciousness. Once I was fully recovered from this nightmare period I was then admitted for surgery on my back, after a further scan on my spine revealed three crumbling vertebrae that previously went undiscovered and also suspected myeloma activity in my spine. The procedure is known as balloon kyphoplasty with cement augmentation, basically a small balloon is inflated within each of the crumbling vertebrae areas creating a cavity which is then filled with a special cement in order to maintain structural integrity. The operation took just over four hours and I was brought around successfully with only a dry mouth and a sore back to show for it and a huge chicken dinner waiting for me. There were six neat stitches, three either side which have now been removed successfully and there's hardly any scarring. I'm now trying to get around as best as I can but it is proving difficult, I am still experiencing lower back spasms which are causing some issues, particularly mornings, but also sometimes throughout the day. Due to the progress of the myeloma and the discovery of activity in my spine I have now commenced chemotherapy and have had my first sessions this week. The chemotherapy is administered in cycles and should take approximately 4 to 6 months with regular checks at the hospital to see how the myeloma is responding to treatment. After Christmas there will be talk of a stem cell transplant which is the hardest part of the process, but if it goes well should give me a longer remission time without the disease. Unfortunately it always comes back and there is no cure, but it can be treated and controlled with further tablets as maintenance doses. If it comes back too aggressively we start again. Please

understand that I will get to church as often as possible but some days are better than others and often I find some are just too difficult. I do miss you all very much, the singing, the communion, the chance to be amongst friends, and everything else about our wonderful church. I'm not sitting here letting things get the better of me, but I'm praying for strength, guidance and help from God to get through each day. I am always here for visitors if any of you would like to come and see me, it's really great to see you and you would be very welcome, however you may have to make your own tea and coffee. I have it in but I'm not very good on my feet sometimes. Thank you once again from the bottom of my heart for all of your prayers that continue to give me great strength at this time and will serve me well for the future. I am both positive and optimistic. Please continue to pray for my family as well as this has taken a huge toll on them and I'm acutely aware of this. They need help just as much as I do. God works wonders in this world and it never ceases to amaze me just how marvellous He is. Thank you again, hope to see you all again soon.
