Building Works Fund (BWF)


We have repaid the money we borrowed and so the Church (that's us, the congregation) are debt free, A truly wonderful achievement in such a short time.

Giving to Good Causes

In our last Newsletter (17th December) we reminded you that it is our practice as a Church to give money to good causes each year either in cash or in kind and 2017 was no different.

Groups that have benefitted 'in kind' in 2017 from our support have been the **Live at Home Scheme** and the **Parent and Toddler Group** who are able to make use of our premises 'free of charge' although we should acknowledge that we do get a donation from the Parent and Toddler group each year as a token of their appreciation and also Live at Home also donated.

A number of the groups that use our premises also benefit from reduced rent by way of giving them our support.

In 2017, using the money we give away, we supported the **Derby Churches Nightshelter Appeal** as they provide overnight accommodation to the homeless of Derby every night throughout the winter months. It is reassuring to know that a warm bed and food is available to the people that sleep rough on our streets if they wish to go along.

Support had been given to **Ebenezer Operation Exodus** and Verity Dockray who is a supporter writes:

"Ebenezer Operation Exodus is a Christian organisation that helps the Jews return to Israel.

This is done by showing them love and care; giving food parcels, helping with documents and passports, assisting by transporting them to Israel. Young, old, families, holocaust survivor and the infirm are all helped in this way.

They have many bases around the world, America, Australia, India, Germany, Russia, UK and even in Israel itself.

It was started by Gustav Scheller in 1991 who helped those Jews in the then USSR to return home, some by boat from Odessa in Ukraine to Haifa in Israel. The organisation has been steeped in prayer and will continue to be so."
