The Monthly Message by Melanie Sant

God is good!

As I write this, I am sitting in the sunshine in Nathan and Michelle's garden in Bulawayo, Zimbabwe having just returned from 12 days on holiday in Mozambique which we spent with the family.

The holiday was fantastic staying in tents overlooking the Indian Ocean, with white sand beaches for Lily and Ella to play on, a real paradise which we were so blessed to visit. We were a real novelty to the local children who kept standing on the beach and just watching us as we were white and the first people to stay in the lodge and use the beach. There were three brothers who played football, except for the fact they didn't have a ball, so they had constructed one out of plastic bags, I must admit it got to me that they didn't even have a ball to play with, when you think of all the toys that our children have.

Getting to and returning from Mozambique was an 800 mile journey each way and was a 'slightly' different matter. Some of the roads were virtually nonexistent and other had huge pot-holes forcing drivers to slow to a snails pace; along the way we would see small huts with thatched roofs and perhaps an area with a few goats and chickens. Sitting alongside the dirt road in the dust would be men, women and the children talking or preparing a meal.

The few shopping areas that we passed were vibrant colourful affairs, piles of oranges stacked on the roadside, clothes piled up on a stall, cows walking down the side and occasionally across the road and children running up to the cars trying to sell pineapples or pistachio nuts, not quite the M&S or ASDA food hall that we are used to !

The people in Mozambique have so little and have to make the best of what they have; they live for today. If they have enough food for today, all is good, tomorrow is another day and they will worry about this tomorrow.

This morning we have been to Nathan and Michelle's Church, Revival. Normally there are two services on a Sunday morning as they cannot accommodate all the congregation in one sitting, however, as it is holiday time there was just the one service starting at 9.00 am and ending at 11.15 am and no, it wasn't communion this is the normal length of service.

The service was inspiring and the Pastor Wayne Nel talked about worshiping God

during the difficult times of life, he must have preached for well over an hour but it didn't feel like that long as he was so committed to what he was saying.

He asked how many of us will binge on a box-set or WhatsApp or Facebook or our hobbies on our computers for around three hours a day and then complain that the sermon on a Sunday goes on for over 45 minutes ? What is more important, being fed by God or enjoying what we want to do?

Do we, I wonder, often lose sight of what is important in our daily life? Why do we text or email friends when it is so much better to meet and talk? Why have we allowed our lives to become so busy that we don't have time to share with each other, to sit in each others company and support each other? Does it really matter if we haven't dusted or vacuumed today, surely we have enough clothes not to have to worry about doing the ironing; if we can meet for a coffee instead? What's a few creases between friends? Why did we allow ourselves to become so materialistic?

We have a busy time together as a church in the next few weeks as we seek to find out where God is leading us at Sinfin Moor. We all have a role to play and I am sure that I speak for all the Stewards when I say that we need your help. All of us need to pray for the right person to be sent to lead us, but there will be other tasks along the way that will need doing, perhaps you physically can not put out the chairs but could you serve coffee, or welcome people into church ? Could you perhaps help with the Sunday group, or help on a Monday morning within the welcome area or prayer team? Do you have another skill which we are unaware of that you could offer? Any offer of help will be gratefully received to enable our worship and weekly activities to flow smoothly whilst we are without a Minister,

Obviously, it goes without saying that we have missed you all greatly over the past three weeks, and have been caught saying to each other 'I wonder how the coffee morning went?' and 'I wonder if the baptism went ok"? It's nice to be away but you do miss your other family.

By the time you read this we will be back (God willing) and I am hoping that I have not already fallen back into the trap of being too busy to spend time with friends!!!!!
