#### The Monthly Message by Ian Sant

At the beginning of October, Wendy and Glenn Roe as well as myself attended the Churches Together for Derbyshire event called 'Working Together is worth it'. It was held at Matlock Methodist/URC because it is more-or-less the centre of the County. You will have seen the advert for this in the Newsletter over the weeks (and months) before. As you can imagine, it was an ecumenical event for anyone interested or involved in ecumenism and for those who just wanted to know more. The main speaker was Geoff Pickup who was the Pastor at New Life Church in Normanton for many years and now although retired, is a Pastor at New Life Church in Belper. He had us enthralled for about an hour talking about his role and the importance of Churches working together.

He used some really great stories and words to explain what he was about and here are just a few examples:

- Every morning as he rises, his prayer is "Lord, what do to want me to notice today?".
- Know or see something
- Know or feel something
- See or do something,
- The smile of God is upon us.
- If Jesus is central, it is a good place to start.
- There's a bigger picture going on 'here'.
- Fly the flag for Church irrespective of denomination.
- Any congregation has a treasure chest of gifts and talents.
- We are a priesthood of all believers.

Whilst I accept these may seem a bit random, they were the words I picked up on and wrote down.

He stated that ecumenism is not new, the day of Pentecost had been and many of them believed his message. In Acts 2 v 43 - 47 we read:

"Many miracles and wonders were being done through the apostles, and

everyone was filled with awe. All the believers continued together in close fellowship and shared their belongings with one another. They would sell their property and possessions, and distribute the money among all, according to what each one needed. Day after day they met as a group in the Temple, and they had their meals together in their homes, eating with glad and humble hearts, praising God, and enjoying the good will of the people. And the Lord added to their group those who were being saved."

There was one Church, generous of Spirit, time and money. Everybody has leadership in them, not always of a group sometimes just a person.

Geoff talked about giving and said that New Life Church in Derby needed about £7,800 each week to fulfil their commitments. We all took a big breath and gulped. He then said their congregation on a Sunday was in excess 900. The Treasurer in me could not resist doing the maths, £7,800 divided by 900 gives an average of £8.66 per person which seems a good guide. Our average at SMC is about £5 per person so the difference is not huge but significant.

In the afternoon we were treated a short talk about Fresh Expressions and what it is about. I suppose basically its 'different' church. By definition:

"Fresh Expressions are new forms of church that emerge within contemporary culture and engage primarily with those who don't 'go to church'.

Not everyone can come to Church on a Sunday and others want something different rather than hymns, readings and a sermon. Just 'google' fresh expressions for more information.

We had times of group discussion and we ended on time at 3.00 pm

Here at SMC I think most of us have embraced ecumenism otherwise we would not be coming to Sinfin Moor Church. As a Church, we have tried very hard to maintain our links with the three denominations to which we belong. This is not easy because unlike a single denomination Church, we

- 4. Thyme for friends


