The Monthly Message by Rev'd Eileen Bangay

My son was asked to preach in the church of a friend, the other side of the city from where he lived. His wife went with him and picked up a leaflet advertising a coffee morning with plant sale, and needing some plants decided she would attend later in the week.

Peter went forward to preach looking really good (this is his unbiased mother writing) in his best Sunday suit, shirt and tie.

As the sermon went on, he first took off his tie, then his jacket, revealing the 'T' shirt underneath, then his trousers showing the shorts he was wearing. He was saying you don't have to dress up for God - He knows what you are like through and through. Whose opinion do you most want, that of your fellow church goers or God?

He then went on to talk of the way St Paul recommended we dress. Paul says that we should stand firm, with the belt of truth and the breastplate of righteousness. As shoes for your feet, put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the Gospel of peace. Have a helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. (Philippians 6 v 10 - 17).

And this is ideal clothing for us as we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit marking the birth of the Church. Having the Holy Spirit poured on us too will help us and all God's people - those who know Him and those who have yet to know Him - to find their way more easily. We merely have to ask and be ready!
