The Monthly Message by Rev'd Eileen Bangay

Harvest comes in so many forms - autumn-hued trees, fogs, frosts, fruit dropping from trees.

Conkers!.

And in our lives there are harvests too. Some have allotments and have the more usual harvest, having grown from seed, fruits and vegetables. Some of us don't have gardens and so, whilst enjoying seeing harvest time come and go, maybe don't realise that every smile we share can bring a harvest of hope into the life of another of God's loved children.

What we gather in might not be sheaves but the supermarket shopping. And there too there can be a harvest we can offer to others by leaving something we have bought in the container for the Food Bank. Then there is the social interaction with everyone we see there from acquaintances, neighbours, to that friendly face at the checkout who has not only a face but a name badge giving us a chance to personalise them by thanking them using their name.

For those no longer able to get out and about, there is the harvest that comes whenever someone visits or phones. One lady I see regularly who can't get out and about was telling me that one day when she was feeling low, a carer came in and asked why she had got her smile on upside down! That, of course, provoked a smile and she no longer felt so low.

One of my contacts was given a copy of New Daylight by the Bible Reading Fellowship, and, as she was new to it, instead of tying it into her daily routine, just dipped in occasionally. One day when she was feeling at least out of sorts, she opened the booklet and there was an article on resilience - keeping going despite what might feel like overwhelming challenges, and she realised that this was what she

had to ask God for, and the fog in her life lifted and she could see more clearly.

Harvest, like Easter and what God's love did for us, can come at any time of year when the spiritual penny drops and we see and take on board that love, returning it and letting it grow. Faith in God does not turn life into a bed of roses. What it gives is a better life despite the thorns any self-respecting rose bed has. It is part of an individual's growing relationship, that God works hard at, and we need to work on too. We need to keep in touch, we need to keep our spiritual muscles well tuned and in good working order. That means giving Him time, telling Him what is in our hearts, and listening too.



We would like to encourage you to place your prayer requests in this box for items to be prayed for at our prayer meeting on a Monday morning.




All items will be treated with the utmost confidentiality. We have seen answers to prayer over the time we have been meeting. God is amazing and really wants us to lift our concerns to Him.

Visits and Communion for housebound


