Four Important Announcements

- 1. If you were in Church last Sunday, you will have heard the announcement from the Church Stewards that we have a candidate to become the new Minister at our Church. His name is Rev'd Paul Desborough and he is currently a Curate at St Alkmunds Church here in Derby. We are still early in the appointment process, but we have agreed with the Acting Archdeacon that Paul will come and lead our worship on Sunday 16th May, It is unusual for a prospective Anglican appointment to come and lead worship in this way, but the Stewards were anxious for him to see you, and you to see him so that you are part of the process. Following this, Paul will come for an interview and a decision made. That is as much as we tell you at this time, so please keep this in your prayers.
- 2. Whilst we are very blessed with a large building, due to the Covid-19 restrictions we will only be able to seat just over 50 people suitably distanced. This should be ample but please be aware that the seats are available on a first come first served basis so, should they be all filled, no one else will be allowed to admitted in to the building.
- 3. It appears that contrary to the information we were given, we <u>cannot</u> hold our AGM after the Morning Service on 16th May. We were advised this week in the Bishop of Derby's weekly Covid-19 update that these meetings cannot be held until after the 17th May. So the plan is for it to be held on Sunday 23rd May after the Morning Service.
- 4. This year we only have to revise the Electoral Roll. The Revision Notice and current list of names had been published is on the notice board by the door in the middle bay. It you think you should be on it check you are, if you are not, speak to Wendy Roe. Remember, in order vote at the AGM, you MUST be on the Electoral Roll in line with our constitution.

The Message by Rev'd Eileen Bangay

So, it's lighter in the morning and the evenings are staying lighter too. The longed-for Summer is on it's way! My flat had dark red blinds but now has white blinds and so lighter mornings and longer evenings are even more apparent to me - and the sunshine shows dust I never noticed before!

Light lays bare every flaw, every fault, so that talking of God as "light" (1 John 1 verses 5b - 9) can bring to mind the searching beam of a spotlight as much as the gentle ray of sunshine.

The light that is God, exposes us, like the dust from which we were made, and it would be much more comfortable to be left discreetly hidden. But God's light shines on us not to sweep us away, but to cleanse and heal us, as Naomie Starkey writes in the BRF New Daylight books. That light prepares us to walk in the light with Him just as He always intended us to.

Too often we try to hide away, like in the story of Adam and Eve, hiding ashamed of their disobedience. Just as He knew exactly what Adam and Eve had been up to, he needs us to see where we so often go wrong and, in the light turn away from that and show our remorse. He loves us so much that He is more than ready, and always prepared, to welcome us back.

Too often, as we get older, we think of ourselves in the old terms of "neither use nor ornament" and that is to deny ourselves as we really are in God's eyes.

Jesus came to drive away that darkness and give us our time in the light, forgiven and free. Free also to bring the light into the lives of others by our way of relating to them - bringing a smile to their lips and joy to their hearts by our way of living and re-acting to whatever life throws or offers. 
Dom and Quoia and Papua New Guinea

As promised, here is an update from Allison George (daughter of our own Anne George) on her recent 'Walk all over Cancer' fund raising.

Cybil and I completed the challenge and clocked up nearly 300 km during the month of March, averaging about 12,000 steps a day. With the kind support of everyone, we managed to contribute an amazing amount of £570 plus Gift Aid to the National effort which brought in £7,530,240 (and still rising as the fund raising page is still open) for Cancer Research UK.

Such an incredible total which is going to make such a big difference in our fight against this merciless disease.

Thanks go to you at Sinfin Moor Church for the £85 you sponsored me for which is included in the total. All the sponsorship made it all so worthwhile and I am thrilled with what we raised.

As we enter another month, I am pleased to tell you that three more people have decided to give directly through their bank account.

Following my reminder last month that this is a good time to review your giving, I have noted that some of you have done just that and increased what you give. Thank you very much for doing so.

Following the announcement by the Stewards on page one about the possible appointment of a new Minister, If this appointment comes to fruition, then the comfortable financial position we have been in will come to an end. Our outgoings will rise substantially as we will be expected to pay the full assessment rather than a portion of it.

With some of the user groups resuming, our financial position is going to improve but put simply, our payments to the Diocese will increase by £15,700 per annum.

We will have to see how this situation evolves and I will keep you informed on the matter but their is no room for complacency on my part as the coming months could well be a lot more challenging for us.
